

#### 4. Outro

There are three words to describe *outro* in English *another* is for singular nouns, for example, *I need another book*

*Other* is for plural nouns, for example, *I need other books*

And we also have a pronoun which is *others* and we use it in this example *I need others* and I know from our conversation, I understand that we are talking about books, we don't need to be specific.

Some more examples *I would like to go to another beach*, that's fine.

*there are lots of other beaches near here* that's fine too

*Ipanema is a beautiful beach but there are others* and I know from our conversation that we are talking about beaches here so we can use *others*

You can even say *Ipanema is beautiful but there are others* because I know from our conversation that Ipanema is a beach so you don't even need to mention beach when you say it.

There are many common mistakes that I see in class, for example:

~~*I need others books*~~ it should be *I need other books* the first example is a Portuguese structure and unfortunately that doesn't work in English.

We only pluralise the noun or the object in English, in this case *books* so ~~*others books*~~ is incorrect and it's a very natural mistake because you are translating directly from Portuguese.

Other examples are ~~*we went to the other bar*~~, this is a mistake, *bar* is singular, *we went to another bar*

~~*I will buy another snacks*~~ should be *I will buy other snacks* because *snacks* is plural.
